Opening	Iain Elliott, Skills Network Chair Opened meeting and reviewed key points from January meeting
Careers & Enterprise Company	<p>Mary Tyler, Careers & Enterprise Company</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research into CEIAG: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ What works: encounters with employers, information about local jobs and how the curriculum connects to work and a plan tailored to an individual's needs, supported by guidance ○ Young adults surveys who recall four or more activities whilst at school were five times less likely to be NEET and earned on average 16% more than peers who recalled no such activities ○ Only in 40% of schools do young people have one encounter each year ○ 66% of businesses believe work experience is crucial for recruitment yet only 38% offer work experience • The Humber region is classed as a cold spot, having 4 indicators including the percentage of employers who offer work experience or work inspiration, the percentage of pupils attaining 5+ A*-C GCSEs and the percentage of A-levels entered that are STEM • Overview of how the Careers & Enterprise company works with one Enterprise Coordinator per 20 schools and 1 Enterprise Advisor (employer) per school • 36 of the 39 LEP areas are currently live or are starting work imminently • 61 Enterprise coordinators who are co-funded by LEPs and the Careers & Enterprise Company are now in place • In excess of 650 schools are now engaged nationally and are already partnered with in excess of 350 Enterprise Advisors • A £5m investment fund designed to double up resources and scale up proven activities has seen 6 projects funded to run in the Humber region, attracting £221,000 of funding. • The Careers & Enterprise Company 'Joining The Dots' conference in Liverpool takes place on 11th May.
